Administrator Mr. Bastian gave the Treasurer's report.

Athletic Director's Report: Jeff Droessler reported that the fall sports are completing their seasons. Tentative fall schedules are full and in place for the 2024 seasons. Middle school basketball practice will begin October 16<sup>th</sup>. High school girls' basketball and gymnastics practice will begin on November 6<sup>th</sup>. High school boys' basketball and wrestling practice will begin on November 13<sup>th</sup>. A pitching mound was built at Swift Park and the ground was smoothed out between the baseball and football fields.

Principal's Report: Mrs. Lawrence reported that district assessments are complete for grades 7-11 MAPS testing. School report cards have been released but are embargoed until November 14<sup>th</sup>. Thank you to Anna Schnitzler for taking the initiative to develop a Positive Leadership Committee. Report cards are being updated for PK-2<sup>nd</sup> grade. CESA 3 is working with us on the development of a district literacy report.

Superintendent's Report: The third Friday in September count is complete with 248 students. Our three-year average went from 241-247. This gives us more revenue to operate on. Conferences were Thursday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, and Friday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. Benton State Bank donated funds to each teacher for use in their classrooms. The Cuba City wrestling club sent us a thank you note and check for \$150. They run a youth camp in Benton during the summer.

Motion by Kieler, seconded by Richardson to pay bills 37371-37450, voiding number 37380 and replace with 37388. Motion carried.

Southwest Technical College did a presentation and delivered a check for \$1,000. The \$1,000 was because Benton had the fourth largest percentage increase in dual credit courses.

Motion by Kieler, seconded by Williams to hire Kelly Mayernik as the 7 <sup>th</sup> and 8 <sup>th</sup> grade boys' basketball coach.
Motion by Klang, seconded by Flatley to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:48 p.m.
